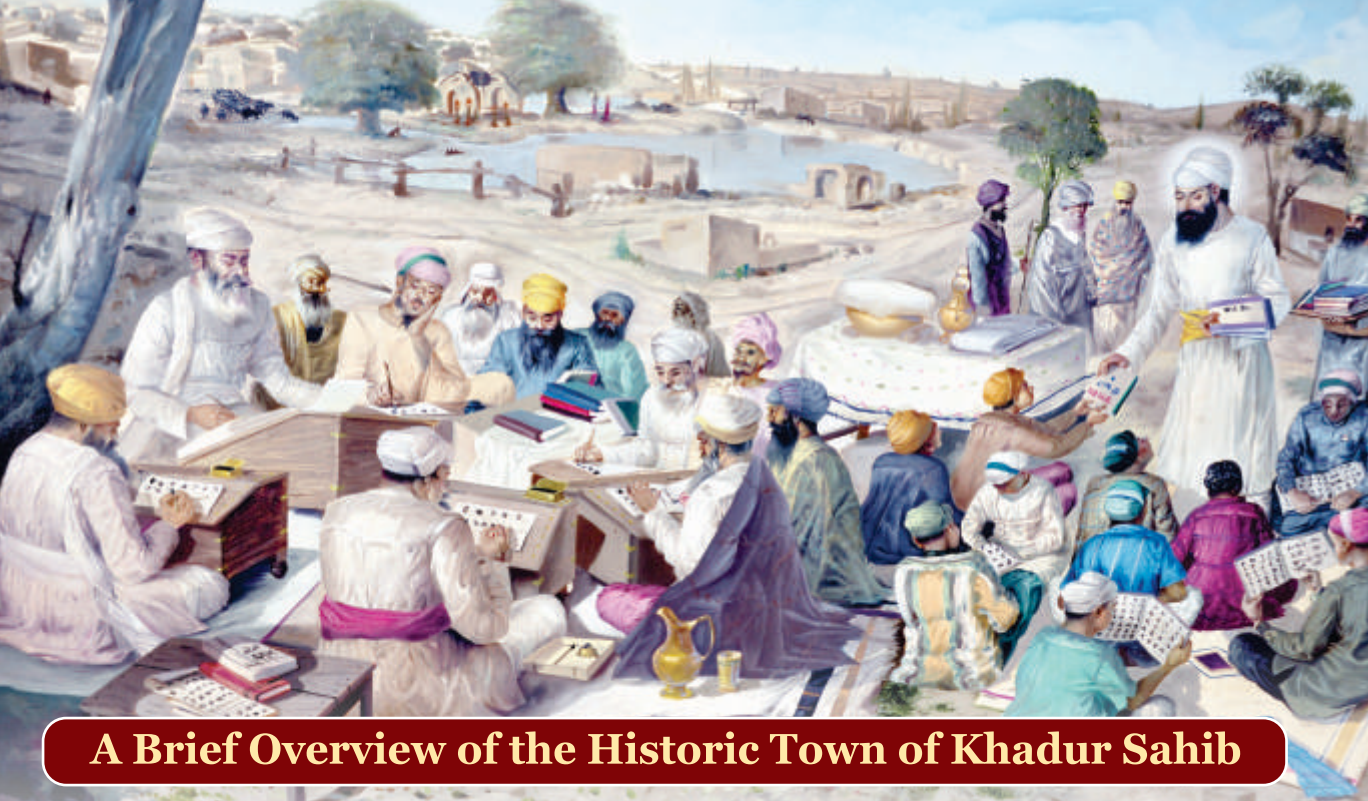

A Brief Overview of the Historic Town of Khadur Sahib

Blessed with the sacred touch of the eight Gurus' Lotus Feet, the historical town of Khadur Sahib is world wide known as the holy town of the Second Sikh Guru, Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the First Reverend Guru visited this town five times to spread His message of Sikhism. This town is located approximately 39 km from Sri Amritsar Sahib, 35 km from Kapurthala, 9 km from Sri Goindwal Sahib and 19 km from Sri Tarn Taran Sahib. Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji spent thirteen years of His Guruship in this town. This fact finds mention in Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji and also in the compositions of Bhai Gurdas Ji.

(Guru Angad Dev Ji left Kartarpur and enlightened the 'Jot' (the Divine Radiance) while sitting at Khadur)

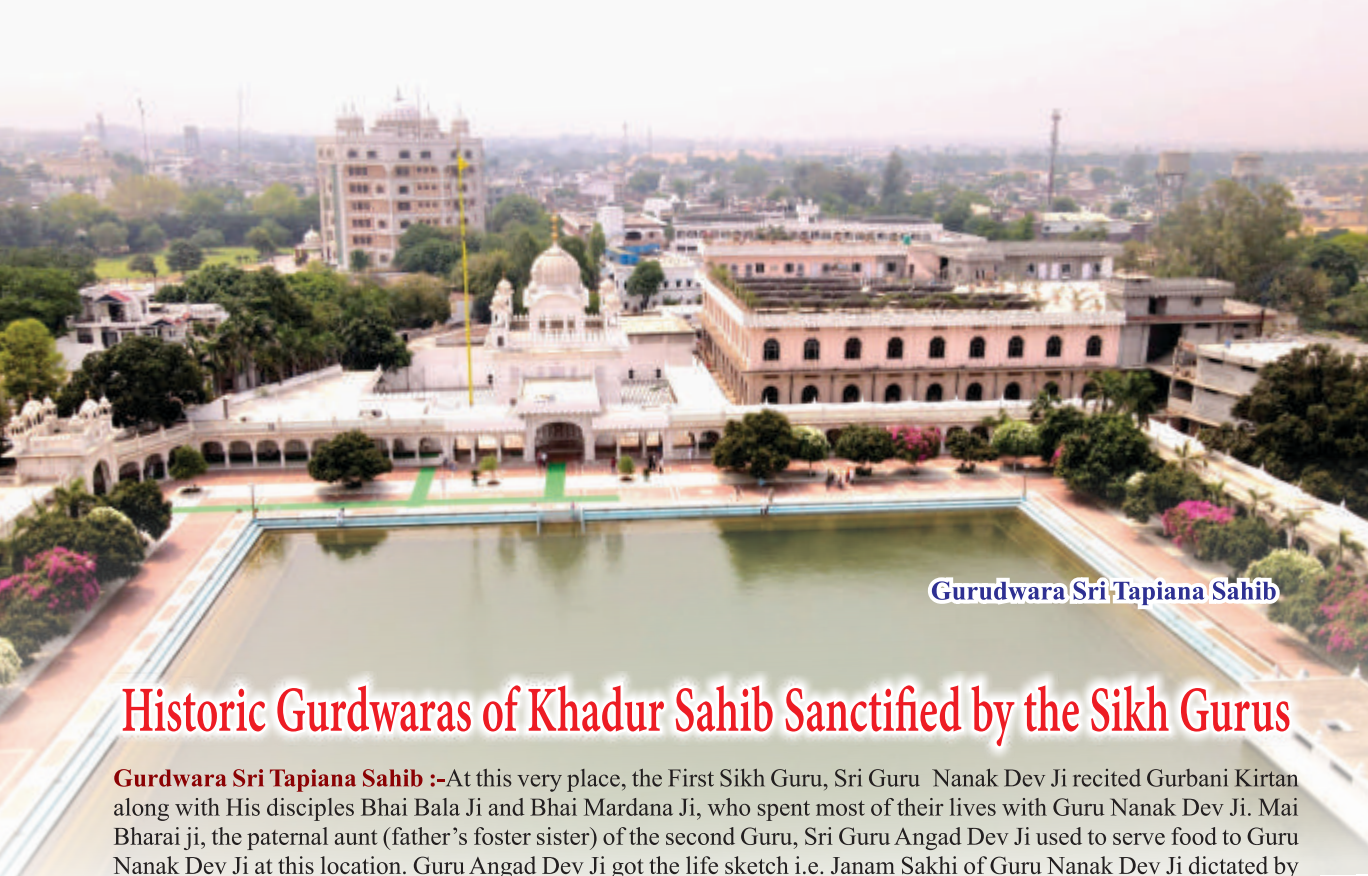
It was at Khadur Sahib that Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji gave an orderly sequence to the Gurmukhi script and accorded it the present form of "Painti Akhri". The first primer of Gurmukhi was completed here by the second Guru and the first school for the promotion and spread of Gurmukhi script was also established at this very place. To make youth fit and strong, Guru ji established "Mal Akhara" (a wrestling ground) here and imbibed the tradition of wrestling among the youth. He even encouraged people to stay away from social evils like drug addiction. Guru Angad Dev Ji preached "Gurbani" (the divine word from the Sanctum of Immortal Creator) among the people and His consort Mata Khiwi Ji served "Desi Ghee Kheer" (rice pudding cooked with clarified butter) in the community kitchen at Khadur Sahib. The testimony of which is found in the hymns in Sri Guru Granth Sahib:

ਬਲਵੰਡ ਖੀਵੀ ਨੇਕ ਜਨ ਜਿਸੁ ਬਹੁਤੀ ਛਾਉ ਪੜਾਲੀ ॥

ਲੰਗਰਿ ਦਉਲਤਿ ਵੰਡੀਐ ਰਸੁ ਅੰਮ੍ਰਿਤੁ ਖੀਰਿ ਘਿਆਲੀ ॥

(- ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਗ੍ਰੰਥ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਜੀ, ਅੰਗ-੯੬੭)

Baba Amar Das Ji, the Third Reverend Sikh Guru, used to fetch a pitcher of water for the sacred bath of Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji from the river Beas at Goindwal Sahib all the way to Khadur Sahib daily. He consistently performed this sewa for 12 long years. After attaining the blessing of Guruship from Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji, Guru Amar Das Ji founded the town of Goindwal Sahib at the former's command and made it a centre for propagation of Sikh religion. Baba Buddha Ji and Bhai Gurdas Ji also visited this town occasionally.

Historic Gurdwaras of Khadur Sahib Sanctified by the Sikh Gurus

Gurudwara Sri Tapiana Sahib :- At this very place, the First Sikh Guru, Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji recited Gurbani Kirtan along with His disciples Bhai Bala Ji and Bhai Mardana Ji, who spent most of their lives with Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Mai Bharai ji, the paternal aunt (father's foster sister) of the second Guru, Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji used to serve food to Guru Nanak Dev Ji at this location. Guru Angad Dev Ji got the life sketch i.e. Janam Sakhi of Guru Nanak Dev Ji dictated by Bhai Bala Ji and written by Bhai Pairra Mokha Ji at this historical place.

Memorial Bhai Bala Ji :- Guru Angad Dev Ji Himself performed the last rites of Bhai Bala Ji at this place. A memorial for the same is established in the periphery of Gurudwara Sri Tapiana Sahib.

Gurudwara Tap Asthaan Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji :- Once while passing through this place Guru Nanak Dev Ji casually told Bhai Lehna Ji (the earlier name of Guru Angad Dev Ji) to put stay over here in this town. Considering this as a divine command, Bhai Lehna Ji resided at this place for a very long time and started meditating until the next visit of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. This spot where Bhai Lehna Ji meditated is situated near Gurudwara Sri Tap Asthaan Sahib. A holy pond; sarovar, is also built in the middle of Gurudwara Tap Asthaan Sahib and Gurudwara Tapiana Sahib.

Gurudwara Mai Bharai Sahib :- Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji bestowed Guruship upon Bhai Lehna Ji at Kartarpur Sahib (Pakistan), gave Him a new name "Angad" and made Him His successor; the second "Guru". The Former ordered the Latter to go to the historical town of Khadur Sahib and preach the doctrines of Sikhism from there to which Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji religiously complied with. But on learning the departure of Guru Nanak Dev Ji from this mortal world Guru Angad Dev Ji, in bereavement, went to his aunt Mai Bharai Ji's residence, confined Himself in a room and meditated for 06 months and 06 days. Baba Buddha Ji, the reverend disciple of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, reached here along with Sikh sangat and requested Guru Angad Dev Ji to come out of His confinement, bless the devotees and preach Sikhism to the ignorant masses. This place is now Gurudwara Mai Bharai Sahib at Khadur Sahib.

Gurudwara Mal Akhara Sahib :- Guru Angad Dev Ji used to bless devotees with Gurbani lessons, teach Gurmukhi script to the children and arrange wrestling events for youth at this place. Once Mughal Emperor Humayun tried to attack Guru Angad Dev Ji with a drawn out sword but met with utter failure. On recognizing Guru Angad Dev Ji's spiritual powers, Humayun felt embarrassed of his misdeed and begged His Lordship for forgiveness.

Gurudwara Sri Darbar Sahib (Angitha Sahib):- While serving Guru Angad Dev Ji with a pot of water for bath from Beas river in Goindwal Sahib, Guru Amar Dass Ji once tripped over a wood peg (loom) of a weaver. The wooden peg is preserved here as such for the devotees. In due course Guru Angad Dev Ji bestowed Guruship upon Baba Amar Das Ji at Khadur Sahib. Guru Angad Dev left this mortal world on March 29th, 1552 here at this place where Gurudwara Sri Angitha Sahib has been constructed. The cremation and last rituals of Guru Angad Dev Ji were performed by Guru Amar Das Ji at Gurudwara Sri Angitha Sahib. Guru Ramdas Ji and Guru Arjan Dev Ji rested here individually at different times while travelling from Sri Goindwal Sahib to Sri Amritsar. Guru Har Gobind Sahib Ji too visited Khadur Sahib along with His family after solemnizing the wedding ceremony of His daughter Bibi Veero Ji at Chabhal (Tarn Taran). On different occasions Sri Guru Harkrishan Ji and Sri Guru Har Rai Ji along with 2200 cavalry visited and sojourned at Khadur

Sahib for a night respectively. The Ninth Sikh Guru, Sri Guru Teg Bahadar also visited this place while travelling from Baba Bakala Sahib. The following facilities are provided to devotees at Gurudwara Sri Darbar Sahib Angitha Sahib:

Multimedia Sikh Museum:- This multimedia Sikh Museum was established in the complex of Gurudwara Sri Darbar Sahib (Angitha Sahib) under the able guidance and kind supervision of Late Dr. Raghbir Singh Bains (Canada). This museum furnishes information about Sikh religion, history and culture through advanced technology including LEDs, touch screens and audio-video techniques. Various paintings depicting the life of Guru Angad Dev have been prepared by renowned painters and are displayed here for visitors.

Sri Guru Angad Dev Yatri Niwas (The Inn):- A beautiful residential complex of about 50 rooms enriched with modern facilities is available here for the devotees visiting to pay obeisance at this historical place. A parking facility is also available in the complex.

Gurudwara Thara Sahib (Sri Guru Amar Das Ji):- After serving the Guru and the devotees, Guru Amar Das Ji used to meditate upon the name of Almighty Waheguru in His leisure time at this place where Gurudwara Sri Thara Sahib stands tall today.

Khuh (Well) Bibi Amro:- This well is located in the complex of Gurudwara Sri Darbar Sahib Angitha Sahib. Keeping in view the need of clean drinking water for devotees Bibi Amro requested her father Guru Angad Dev Ji to get a well dug for the thirsty. Guru Sahib beatified her plea and got a well dug up for the parched.

More Information about Khadur Sahib:- Bhai Jodh Ji, one of the true disciples of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, was a resident of this village. Bhai Lehna Ji (Guru Angad Dev Ji) used to listen to holy verses from Bhai Jodh Ji at amrit vela i.e. early morning before His maiden meeting with Guru Nanak Dev Ji. In due course, Bhai Lehna Ji visited Kartarpur (Pakistan) to meet Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Many more Sikhs from this historical town hugely contributed in various battles during the time of Guru Gobind Singh Ji. Three Sikhs, Bhai Punjab Singh, Bhai Bhagwan Singh and Bhai Damodar Singh who attained martyrdom in the battle of Chamkaur Sahib, too were residents of this town. Two Sikhs of this village were among the 40 martyrs of Mukatsar Sahib. Among the five beloved ones, Baba Binod Singh who accompanied Baba Banda Singh Bahadur from Nanded to Punjab, was from Khadur Sahib. Another great personality of Sikh history Baba Kahan Singh, the son of Baba Binod Singh was also a resident of this town.

Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib

After Sher-e-Punjab Maharaja Ranjit Singh the services of construction and maintenance of Sikh shrines implemented by the Sikh Gurus, were further undertaken by Sant Baba Gurmukh Singh Ji, Sant Baba Sadhu Singh Ji and Sant Baba Jhanda Singh Ji about a hundred years ago. These great personalities settled down at Khadur Sahib for Kaar Sewa. Their successor Baba Uttam Singh Ji continued this service in an unimpeded manner. He also initiated construction of many educational institutes along with various other services at Sikh shrines. After his demise Kaar Sewa services related to the spread of Sikh religion, education, sports, environment conservation project, construction and maintenance of gurdwaras, sarovars, diwan halls, langar halls, inns, roads, bridges are being run under the wise and able guidance of Baba Sewa Singh Ji, Head Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib. 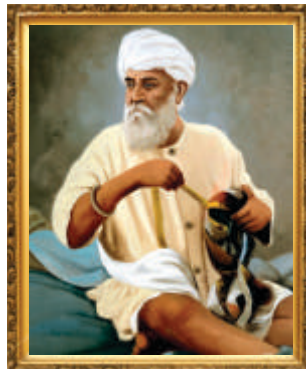

Mata Khiwi Langar Hall

A beautiful and colossal three-storey langar hall has been constructed in commemoration of Guru Angad Dev Ji's consort Mata Khiwi Ji. As per the tradition set by Mata Khiwi Ji at langar, a delicacy, "Kheer Ghiali" is prepared with the cooperation of the sangat and served with utmost respect and enthusiasm to the hungry. To perform various services at langar, volunteers (sangat) from the nearby 80 villages arrive on their own accord with full devotion, persistence and enthusiasm to prepare and serve meals, wash the soiled utensils and clean the langar hall. Moreover, 52 villages perform the weekly services of supplying milk and other raw materials for langar. Interestingly, people enthusiastically wait for their monthly turn to perform various services in the langar hall.

Baba Uttam Singh Yatri Niwas (Inn)

This Yatri Niwas (inn) is located in front of Mata Khiwi Langar Hall wherein well-furnished rooms are available for the comfortable stay of the sangat.

Maintenance of relics related to Guru Sahib

Implementing on the advice of experts from the Department of Archaeology, endeavours have been undertaken for the maintenance of an ancient monument 'Baradari' (related to Sri Guru Angad Dev ji.) This Baradari is located near the sarovar at Gurdwara Tapiana Sahib. Moreover, historic well 'Bibi Amro Ji' at Gurdwara Angitha Sahib, yet another well at Mata Khiwi Langar Hall and a few other historic monuments and relics, too are being taken good care of by Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib.

The Quincentenary Prakash (Birth) Gurburab Celebrations of Sri Guru Angad Dev Ji were solemnized with kind cooperation and great enthusiasm of devotees from all over the world on April 18, 2004 at Khadur Sahib. Many welfare projects in the field of education, religion, sports and environment were planned and initiated to mark the event memorable. On this occasion, Nishan-E-Sikhi Charitable Trust (Regd.) was established under the patronage of Baba Sewa Singh Ji, Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib for the smooth functioning of these welfare projects. The foundation stone of a multi-storey building, 'Nishan-E-Sikhi' was traditionally laid by Honorable 'Panj Pyare Sahibaan' in 2004. The construction of the building was initiated by Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib in 2006. S. Kartar Singh Thakral and family from Singapore generously contributed for the construction of this pentagon shaped eight-storey building, the construction of which was completed by devotees under the Kaar Sewa in 2011. The fully furnished building was inaugurated by S. Kartar Singh Thakral in April 2011. This unique building was designed by renowned architect S. Mohinderjit Singh from Amritsar. S. Jasvinder Pal Singh is serving presently as the Secretary of the Trust.

The landscaping layout around the super structure provides a green look to the campus. Well-designed building with abundant ventilation and sunlight, well-equipped state-of-the-art infrastructure including elevators, intercoms, CCTVs and a lease line of 300Mbps Wi-Fi internet, energy-efficient electrical appliances, adequate air-conditioned rooms, silent generators, modern auditorium for seminars, special lectures or other functions, ramp facility for senior citizens and the handicapped, a conference hall furnished with latest technology, world class library, class rooms and study rooms and all that enhance the building stand unparalleled.

• Sri Guru Angad Dev Institute of Religious Studies

Sri Guru Angad Dev Institute of Religious Studies, Khadur Sahib offers a five year diploma course in Gurmat Studies integrated with graduation and post-graduation in Religious Studies at under Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar for students who have passed/appeared 10+2 in any stream. Students are trained in Gurbani Santhya (Grammar), Sikh Philosophy, Sikh History, Gurmat Lecture, Kirtan, Literature, and are provided all particulars of Old Gurmat Scriptures at the Institute. The college and university fees, hostel accommodation, langar (food) and travelling are made available without any charges to the students.

Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib is endeavoring diligently to maintain the natural balance of the earth and is also ensuring to provide clean environment to the future generation. These beautiful places will for sure appeal to the enlightened spirits of the devotees by creating a suitable environment for meditation and the worship of the Almighty.

Nishan-E-Sikhi Charitable Trust (Regd.), Khadur Sahib being run under Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib has undertaken various environment conservation projects and has factually implemented the mega project of planting trees and then rearing them like its own children so as to visualize the aim of “Balihari Kudrat Vasiya” in real terms. **To commemorate the 500 birth anniversary of Guru Angad Dev Ji (2004) in an innovative way, Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib launched an environment conservation drive in 1999** and has been engrossed in various environmental projects till date. Under this drive, **different varieties of trees have been planted on either side of the roads, in parks, at public places in Punjab, Delhi, Rajasthan, Madhya-Pradesh and Maharashtra in allegiance with the Sangat.** Especially the 'trio' of Banyan, Peepal and Neem trees have been planted. To fulfill the demand of sapling and plants for the environmental projects, **two big nurseries have been established at Khadur Sahib and Madhya Pradesh.** About **60 volunteers** and **15 water tanks** have been assigned the task of planting trees and looking after their immediate needs. As compared to traditional farming, orchards are more helpful in keeping the environment green and fertile. Keeping this fact in mind, farmers are being motivated to adopt gardening. To preserve the biological diversity of the earth, people are being encouraged to plant traditional trees. **Till now, fruit orchards on 400 acres of land have been grown by encouraging the farmers. The "Bagh Baba Sadhu Singh Ji" is an extremely beautiful fruit orchard near Gurudwara Tapiana Sahib (Khadur Sahib). 36 types of fruit trees including Grapes, Plum, Loquat, Pear, Stone Pear, Sweet lime, Malta, Orange, Sapota, Lychee, Mango, Guava, Berry, Chakotra, Jackfruit, Fig have been planted in this orchard. 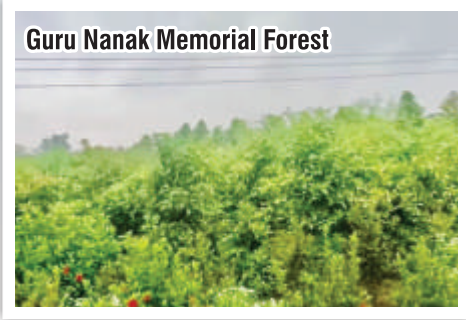

are conducted to visit villages at a prescheduled time to plant trees like Neem, Jammun, Mango, etc. in every house in the village after making them aware of the necessary information regarding environment and trees. Besides villages, trees have also been planted at public places like schools, gurudwaras and vacant community lands of the villages. Through this campaign, **trees have been planted in houses of approximately 500 villages till now.** Under the affairs of Environment and Biodiversity Conservation, Kaar Sewa Khadur Sahib has a set-target of planting '550 Guru Nanak Memorial Forests' i.e. mini forests to mark the 550th birth anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. **Out of which 369 mini-forests have successfully been established till (Feb, 2026), each forest comprising 50 different types of trees (Fruit trees, Shade trees, Medicinal trees and Flowering trees: 25% each) are being planted per forest. A total of 8,09,324 trees have been planted on 538.5km stretch of roads, public places, orchards, empty places and in mini-forests at different places.** Under the Environment Conservation Project, the followings have been accomplished so far with the wholehearted contributions of Sangat:

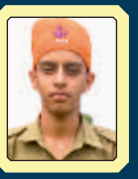
